
DID YOU KNOW?




- The oldest lighthouse in Croatia (more than 160 years old) – Veli Rat – is located on the island of Dugi otok.




Dugi otok Island




- From the 16th century to the beginning of the 19th century, Dubrovnik and its surrounding area were an independent republic – The Republic of Ragusa.



The small fishermen's village of Lumbarda is well-known for its sandy beaches while pebble beaches such as Pupnatska Luka or Bili Bok on the little island of Proizd are equally well-known.
